# For Your Reflection

If it is true, as I am claiming, that we Christians are often reticent about faith and frequently choose just to keep our mouths closed in public about God, why there is so much evidence to the contrary? Our culture chatters about God incessantly. There is a plenty of God talk out there in the public arena. Politicians talk about God. Televangelists talk about God. Mystics who write best-selling books on spirituality talk about God. People in sports stadiums frantically wave posters with Bible passages. Evangelists pass out "Are You Saved?" tracts door to door. Radio DJs and TV newscasters toss off references to God. Popular movies and supermarket tabloids rattle on about God. Some highway billboards even purport to be messages from God ("Don't make me come down there—God"). Just turn on the radio, read People magazine, or ride down Main Street—God talk reverberates everywhere.

We sense, though, that amid all the God chatter and religious white noise there is a serious lack of depth, even what could be called a famine of authentic speech about God. People talk and talk and talk about God, but the language often seems empty. The God words strike the ear with the dull clink of counterfeit coins. What is missing in our culture is not God talk but authentic God talk. When the Bible describing a particular moment in Israel's history, says, "The word of the Lord was rare in those days" (1 Samuel 3:1), it does not mean that people did not talk about God then. No doubt, people in that time spoke about God as much as ever— in houses of worship, in homes, in the marketplace. It was just that all of their God talk lacked the ring of authenticity. In short, there was a lot of God talk but very little God in it.

# Engagement Team takes next steps

Piedmont Community Church is committed to growing engagement (one's emotional connection and sense of belonging to the church, not just involvement) as a vital way of achieving our strategic plan to improve our sustainability, vibrancy and communication to thrive in coming years.

When a congregation has a high percentage of highly engaged members, great things happen, like serving others more, inviting others more, having a greater sense of life satisfaction, growing spiritually, giving more, feeling cared for and appreciated and developing deep friendships. These elements make a strong community for us now while creating an inviting, thriving community for new people to join.

Dedicated to guiding the engagement growth process this year, our committee needs to learn your thoughts and feelings about the church before we know how to grow engagement. We are learning in two phases. Phase 1 was the Congregational Survey that was completed last fall. Phase 2 is a series of Congregational Conversations that will take place in March.

### The Survey

We heard from over half of our active members, which is exceptional for survey participation. Your voices really matter. However, we found that several important voices to the future of our congregation were under-represented in the survey - new members, parents of teens, parents of children under 13 and inactive members.

### The Conversations

In March, we will host focused, 90-minute, facilitated conversations to gather insights from those who did not participate in the congregational survey and from the rest of the church community, for example - new members within 3-5 years, parents of teens, parents of children, seniors, recent empty nesters (parents with youngest child 19-26 years), inactive members, past leaders, friends of Piedmont Community Church who are committed non-members and membership at large (everyone).

We will email and host courtyard sign ups after worship to invite your interest in participating. Please only say "yes" if you are interested and available on the date specified. While many could fit in more than one group, there is only the opportunity to attend one conversation per person. We'll invite you to the one in which we feel we need your input the most and after making sure we have a diverse, balanced group.

With the most productive group size of 12-15, we thank you for understanding if not everyone can participate.
