





#### Messenger Survey Results

Thank you to the 90 readers who took time to participate in our brief, 4-question survey. While the questions were few, the answers are extremely helpful to our mission moving forward.

#### What We Learned


Of the 90 participants answering, 78% read *Messenger* weekly, while 16% read twice a month and 6% read just once a month.

During the summer months, *Messenger* was read by an average of 500 people weekly or 72% of our total mail list. Summer reading was down just 2% from our yearly average of 74%. Average email open rate for our industry is just 38%.

The preferred reading method continues to be online, with versions evenly split with 44% reading the full-sized PDF on desktop or laptop computers, while 43% read the original Mobile version on mobile device. 14% read the paper version of *Messenger* made available Sundays during worship.

The majority of our readers, 80%, read *Messenger* for info related to upcoming social and community events. The second most popular area of interest (73%) is reading details surrounding upcoming worship. We tested this interest recently by printing full details of a summer sermon schedule, including sermon titles, description, scripture and preacher information. Traditionally, this has not been a focus of *Messenger*. However, this response leads us to consider making this information available regularly.

The graph below shows response for all areas of interest:




Finally, the question regarding access to information linked from *Messenger* taught us that 70% of readers use the buttons or hot links, while only 8% scan a QR Code. 22% of readers surveyed do not click links or scan QR Codes. The low response to QR Codes is expected as this is a feature used almost exclusively by the estimated 30 readers who enjoy the paper version of *Messenger* each week.
